Official 2012 Challenge Rules

Pre-fishing is welcome on Saturday, February 25, 2012. No pre-fishing is allowed the morning of the tournament.

All participants must have a valid South Dakota fishing license. All laws of the State of South Dakota must be observed at all times. Receiving a fishing violation citation will result in immediate disqualification.

Starting position will be determined by order of received entry fee.

No automobiles on the ice during the tournament. ATV's & snowmobiles will be permitted.

No permanent ice shacks. Collapsible and flip-over styles are allowed.

Fisherman must fish at least 25 ft apart. No communication is allowed between fishermen, this includes cell phones or walkie-talkies.

Participants may drill as many holes as they wish, however any open hole may be fished by any competitor as long as they maintain the 25 ft rule.

No alcoholic beverages allowed during the tournament hours.

Auger covers on blades are required while augers are mounted to machines or during travel.

Electronics (flasher/sonar/video systems) are allowed.

Live bait is allowed

The best 10 pan fish will be weighed; this includes any combination of crappie or bluegill. Other fish caught during the tournament may be kept but not weighed. All fish weighed in must be kept alive in a 5-gallon bucket. No sorting of fish will be allowed during the weigh-in and any sorting must be performed while on the ice during tournament hours. In the event that more than 10 fish are brought into be weighed we will subtract the largest weight from the bucket from the remaining 10 fish.

There will be no cheating allowed. Incidents that may be viewed as cheating include: sharing fish among contestants, purchasing fish from outside tournament fishermen, bringing fish onto the lake on your person, or within your equipment, holding fish above or below the ice, etc.

Failure to comply with any contest rules subjects contestants to disqualification and removal from the tournament site, as determined by contest officials.
