

8-2-1: PERMITTED TREES:

Trees used for street tree planting shall be hackberry, American linden or basswood species, hard maple species, oak species, thornless honey locust, any species of ash or other tree approved by the park and recreation board. The variety of such trees to be so planted and the spacing thereof in planting shall be subject to the approval of the park and recreation board. (1984 Code § 37-5)

No street trees planted shall measure less than one inch (1") in diameter of trunk one foot (1') above the ground. (1984 Code § 37-6)

8-2-3: TRIMMING:

- A. The occupant or owner of any premises abutting upon any street shall keep all trees standing upon such premises or between the same and the center of the adjoining streets so trimmed that they comply with the specifications of the park and recreation board. (1984 Code § 37-2)

- B. All large established trees shall be trimmed to a sufficient height to allow free passage of pedestrians and vehicular traffic and in such manner so as to allow eight feet (8') clearance over all sidewalks and twelve feet (12') clearance over all streets and alleys. (Ord. 2377, 10-17-2011)

8-2-4: REMOVAL OF DANGEROUS TREES:

The owner of any property upon which there is any tree constituting a hazard to persons or property shall remove the same at his own expense. In case such owner shall neglect or refuse to remove such a tree upon notice by the park and recreation board, the same may be removed by the board, and the cost thereof shall be collected from such owner. (1984 Code § 37-13)
